June 3rd, 2018 – THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Are we ready to give?

Today, we celebrate Corpus Christi (the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ). This special Feast is celebrated in remembrance of Jesus who gave His life for our salvation and commanded us to celebrate the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist in his memory.

The Church is reminding us to reflect on the covenant we have with God today. There were several covenants in the Old Testament but the final covenant came with Jesus. Jesus had to take **human face** to get the covenant in place. It was Jesus who took care of sin and guilt in our hearts that was separating us from God. Jesus, the sinless Lamb of God, died the death that we deserve because of our sin; so that we could be forgiven.

So what is the answer? When we are about to go out the priest reminds us "Go out, love and serve the Lord". But what is society saying to us? It says Religion is private. Keep it in your religious places. Society doesn't want any impact of religion. So what can we do? <u>Live</u> <u>a life worthy of Jesus</u>, <u>because he was crucified for each of us</u>. When we do our day today activities, embrace people with a honest, loving, caring heart. Be with them in their troubles. If we don't have strength for this, we should visit the Blessed Sacrament frequently and request additional power.

As St Thomas Aquinas says in one of his Corpus Christi Hymns "Love does not consume: it gives and, in giving, receives.

As a final note this is what Corpus Christi tells us. Yes, there is such a thing as love, and therefore there is transformation, therefore there is hope and hope gives us the strength to live and face the world.

We all need that transformation. Power house for this transformation is Holy Mass. Let's Honor it and participate in it worthily and frequently. Then we will be ready to offer ourselves as Jesus did.
