Gospel of Mark 10. 17 -30

"A man ran up and knelt before him (Jesus) and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

²¹ And Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "You lack one thing: go, sell all that you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." ²² Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions."
