DECEMBER 16, 2018 - THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Rejoice Always and Be Blessed

Today is third Sunday of the advent which is often referred to as "Gaudete Sunday". Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means for us. If we closely noticed the color of the vestments are changed to rose. Rose candle will be lit. Entrance Antiphon stars with Rejoice. Why all these changes? It is real expression of Joy and jubilation. Because Jesus is about to visit our hearts.

Is that real, you might ask. We should remember Joy should be the basic mood of being Catholic. Really! you might argue. As we can see when we move from sacred space of liturgy and prayer to the "real world" of daily life, we are bombarded with loss, pain, violence, and discord that seem to contradict any reason to "rejoice." For those who have lost loved ones, the anticipation of the holidays only amplifies the lack of harmony. Some mailboxes are full of end of the year appeals from religious and charitable groups "tax deductible" donation mails. Indeed, there seems to be little to rejoice about in all of this! So--how do we "feel joy and great delight" in the midst of all of this?

"Rejoice" is a rare term in today's vocabulary. Webster's tells us that "joy" is the emotion evoked by well-being, success, or good fortune, or by the prospect of possessing what one desires." We can be assured that if we trust Webster's we will never rejoice. But just what is it that we desire? To answer this question we need to reflect on two other queries: Who am I? Why do I do what I am doing? Where I am heading?

I don't think anybody came to this earth because we wanted to be born to the family where we are. At the same token one day we will leave this earth not because we want to leave but our visa is expired. Now why on earth are we living? In order to answer these questions we have to look at the life of Jesus. He knew he came from his father's heart, and has to go to his father's home. Because of that reason he spend his life worthy of father, by doing his father's will. Since he completed his mission successfully on earth, God the Father had no option (for his obedience) but to resurrect Jesus. We were benefitted by his obedience.

Now it is our time to pay it forward. How should we do it? Today's' gospel has rough outline for it from John the Baptist and later Jesus himself confirms it.

"Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise."

"Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

This can speak volumes. Simply take care of your neighbor. Some may ask "Am I the keeper of my neighbor?" Answer is YES. Not to judge him and find everything he does and publish in social media. But to make sure he is up to his salvation. That is what John the Baptist started and Jesus accomplished and he wants us to be a member. We have to remember Jesus wants us to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the imprisoned etc. Simply care for lost and marginalized.

During last week we talk about letting him drive and relax. He will point us in this direction. I am so sure about this because this is how he works in me. Sometimes he want us to donate for the Knights' Table, visit a homeless person, singing carols in senior home or any other activity out of the blues. But that activity completes there will be endless joy in our hearts. It cannot be taken by any possessions. There is one word of caution. The works we do should be guided by Jesus and only by his voice. Otherwise these is a bigger chance we will be carried out only by works and forget about who initiated the work. Then we will be lost. It is like today's Christmas. Main actor of the Christmas is Jesus. But today do you see any picture of Jesus in any of malls. We are celebrating Christmas (Birthday of Jesus) without birthday boy. What is shame? Let's not get lost in Christmas but really rejoice. **Rejoice Always**.
