Who are we depending on?

We have now entered the great season of Lent. Our annual retreat. Traditionally on this First Sunday of Lent, the Gospel speaks of the temptations of Jesus in the desert. We might think these as another three incidents that happened in the past. If we want to understand what is happening in our lives we have to read it carefully.

The first temptation (to change stones into bread) and the third (to jump from the top of the Temple) try to turn Jesus away from his role as the Servant-Messiah to become an eye-catching, self-serving superstar. "Follow me because I am the greatest." The second temptation (to worship the devil who can give power and wealth) tries to entice Jesus away from the true direction of all human living – the love and service of God and his creation. Simply from all these temptations, the evil one is tempting Jesus to take control of the current situation rather than depending God.

Isn't this happening to us today? Most of us want to be eye-catching figures rather than service oriented people. We want our name to be here and there. When we think of temptations, we tend to think of sexual sins, telling lies, losing our tempers, gossiping about people's (imagined) faults, getting angry, feeling resentment etc. Most of us want material wealth for its own sake (the ability to turn anything into money ['bread']), to want status (everyone looks up to me), and power (I can manipulate people and things for my own ends). These things are major temptations because we want to control ourselves. When we are blinded (caught) with this we will not see our spouse, children, coworkers, parishioners, siblings simply no one. Anybody is an object or a thing. On the other hand, we do not see justice, truth, life or love. We only see power and wealth. These are the success factors of the world. We want to be "Successful" according to the "worldly standards". Aren't we?

Some may ask what is wrong with that. If I work hard, I will get more money and what is wrong about it?

First of all, we will have a "Self-centered" lifestyle instead of "Christ-centered" lifestyle. Main problem here is we are losing LOVE. As a result, we lose compassion. We lose joy and peace too. Every day we will live in fear and anxiety. But some of us still come to church or at least say "Our Father...". Do we realize what does that mean "Thy Kingdom Come.?". What are the values of the "Kingdom"? When we belong to the kingdom we should have peace (peace that we can go through any problem without complaining), love (not the human love, but the unconditional love to accept anybody as the way they are), and joy (not from a party but from internal joy we have by the things we accomplish). Happiness anybody experience from these cannot be taken away by anybody and cannot be obtained by anything in this world.

Many of us are chasing the idols of wealth, status and power just as pagans. They are not the way of Jesus, they are not the way of the Kingdom, nor indeed are they the way to a fully human, fully satisfying life for anyone.

How do we turn?

How did Jesus overcome? He knew where he came from (from Father). He knew his job on this earth (do the will of the Father) and He knew where he had to go (Back to father). Do we know this? Possibly, we understand we came from the Father. Do we live for him (or we live for Power and wealth)? Are we ready to go to him at any given time? If we try to answer these questions, we will be forced to change our lifestyles. Hope we will come back to our sensors.
