## SEPTEMBER 1, 2019 – TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

## Gospel of Luke14.1, 7-14

September is here and it means many things to different people. For some both tension and excitement about starting High School or University; others meeting new students and co-workers. However, no matter what circumstances we find ourselves in, September seems to call us to return to some form of productivity and order.

Let us welcome September and open our hearts to Jesus' call today.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is invited by the leader of the Pharisees for a meal on the Sabbath, immediately we are told that the lawyers and the Pharisees were watching him closely.

Jesus barely in the room takes a glance and sees that the guests already choose the places of honor.

Immediately Jesus tells them a parable.

So, he tells a story about meals and honor. It is an unusual "parable" in light of its clear references. After all, the host and the guests' behaviour were common standard in Jesus' days. They knew, who was who and the guests would be distinguished people, who could be of benefit to the host and each other.

To secure one's place in this system, it was proper to invite friends, family, and rich neighbors. Reciprocal requests would ensue, as the public acknowledgement of an honorable person may bring its own rewards.

Jesus' words are a challenge to the honor system embedded in first-century culture.

We might say, "Our system today is very different everyone is treated as equal; how does this apply to us?"

Let's be honest. How likely are we, to go out and invite the homeless for dinner at our table? Is it even practical in this day and age? We do instead, heed Jesus' teaching by making donations to the poor box, helping with food banks and shelters, we give to Share Life and many other worthy causes. This is good indeed but easy.

However, what happens when we take the words of Jesus to heart? Do we ever pass, on inviting to our dinner, those who may cause us embarrassment and discomfort?

Jesus request is very challenging. Have you had dinner in the dinning room at a nursing home or at a shelter? If you have then perhaps, you understand what Jesus is getting at and what he is actually asking of us.

This is not about doing good so we can receive our reward in heaven; this is about putting ourselves right in the midst of the suffering of others.

This is a tough call. This is about us sharing the cross of others so we can participate in the redemptive work of Jesus Christ. This is about today, it is about our life, being an open invitation to others, who are lost and heavy burdened, to come and take shelter in our healing presence.

It is an open invitation from us to the marginalized; inviting them to a place where they do not feel judged or outcast; but rather a place where their burden is lightened and their heart gladdened. It is a place of belonging, with Christ at the centre. The outward scene, to the worldly eye looks definitely grim, but the joy within every Christ filled heart is uplifting.

As Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. understood, "Our goal is to create a beloved community and this will require a qualitative change in our souls as well as a quantitative change in our lives."

We do have what it takes to follow Jesus, the question, are we truly willing?
