

DECEMBER 1, 2019 - FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Gospel: Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man.....Therefore, stay awake! For you do

not know on which day your Lord will come..... So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44 – Isaiah 2:1-5 – Romans 13:11-14

Are we awake and alert in our time of waiting? Are we ready: In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it; many peoples shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, **that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths.**" Isaiah 2:1

The readings today are filled with warning, instruction, preparation, and the promise of Blessed Hope of the second coming of the Messiah, Jesus. Advent is the time when we, as Christians, each year are to prepare ourselves with spiritual expectation, watchfulness, and preparedness to celebrate the coming of the Christ child, as His Second Coming moves ever closer. Over 2000 years ago, of course, not too many were expecting Him. As the scripture reads, "*He came unto His own, but His own received Him not*". They were spiritually blind, and certainly not expecting a tiny baby in swaddling clothes lying in a manger, to be their Messiah!

In Matthew's Gospel today, however, Jesus is very clear about what we can expect at His second coming, and also the very signs of the times that will preface His Coming; but we need not fear, as some will do, but instead, "*look up for your redemption draws nigh*". How can we be so prepared to receive our Saviour? We can maintain regular attendance at the Sacrament of Reconciliation. After a good examination of conscience, one that goes right down to the root of our sin, we can come before the Lord in humility to receive His Grace for interior purification, that "he may instruct us in his ways," and His Grace will help keep us on the narrow path.

A clean and contrite heart, He will not despise. We can pray. Jesus said to His Disciples, ".... Watch and pray..." . Remember that our whole existence is for our preparation to see God, and in that preparation we must know and follow His Ways and walk in them in truth with all humility and obedience. We are merely journeying, we are travelers passing through, on our way Home. We are to be watchful, and to know the signs of the times, as in today's Gospel reference to Noah's day. There was an overwhelming amount of violence, idolatry, sexual immorality, as we see increasingly happening in our own time. Therefore, let us watch and pray, that our hearts will be clean, our minds pure, and our spirit free of sinful encumbrances that may block our sight, preventing us from truly seeing the signs of His Coming, and being ready to meet our King and Saviour, the Holy One of Israel, the Lamb of God, God incarnate. **Praise His Holy Name.**
