FEBRUARY 27 – EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

LOOK AT THE MIRROR

Today, we read the Sermon of the Plain (not Sermon of Mount) from Luke's Gospel. This is known as one of the major sections from Jesus, for his disciples (for us today). Last week, we had the instructions of how we treat others (actions towards others); today we are going deeper to find out how we should get our attitudes right. It is all about us.

The opening commands not to judge and not to condemn and are already bound up with fundamental attitude. They raise the issue of just how difficult it is for people to have the kind of understanding that would really allow them to make judgments of others. We cannot pass judgment unless we have some vision and understanding. It is not unusual at all, to hear people talk with great authority on things of which they know very little. People, who never open a Bible, seldom go to church, are not involved in its activities or not even Christians, frequently have no hesitation in saying what is wrong with the Church. This does not meant Church has no faults. Nor does it mean that the Church's weaknesses should not be highlighted. The same applies in families. When we have a problem in our families (weakness or sickness of a family member or relative); it does not matter to that family, but it is a major discussion point on other's tables. It does mean that one should speak from genuine knowledge, accurate data and to the people who can do something about it. The same also applies to everything else we like to pass judgment on. This may be the reason why today's first reading reminds us, "Praise no man before he speaks, for it is then that men are tested." (Sirach 27:7). We have to be extremely careful the way we speak and what we speak, especially when we speak about others. What's going to happen when we speak about others? Guess what? We often tell people a lot more about ourselves than those we are condemning. Real inner person comes out.

Here is the other side of this coin. Jesus never says any action is legal. Of course, there are actions we have to be concerned about. But how? "Stop judging by mere appearances, but instead judge correctly" (John 7:24). Here we have a clue as to the right type of judgment versus the wrong type. If we judge by appearance (without proper facts), it is superficial judgment. That is, what we are not supposed to do. Same way hypocritical judgment, Harsh / unforgiving judgment, Self-righteous judgment are wrong too. Then how should we judge? We have to discern before we pass any decision on anybody. Then let that person know lovingly. Not as a statement or an order. Gentle discussion. We might argue Jesus has acted in a different way. We are not in a place to act like him. Are we?

No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher.

Most of the time Jesus has patience with us more than he should, but we do not replicate the same with others. Isn't that the truth?

What can we get out of this? I have to change. Let me be in charge of my own life and stop trying to change others, then others will see Jesus in me. Let me be the mirror of Jesus.
