

FEBRUARY 21st – FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT



Gospel: Mark 1.12-15 – The Temptation of Jesus

Fighting Temptations

During this First Sunday of Lent we hear the account of Jesus's temptation in the wilderness. Facing temptations is a part of life.

St. Anthony the Great says to "Expect temptation to your last breath." Each time we face a temptation we have the choice of whether we follow Christ or turn away from Him. We should ask ourselves, how hard do we fight to resist temptations?

St. Josemaria Escriva says to fight temptations "Saint Francis of Assisi rolled in the snow, Saint Benedict threw himself into a thorn bush, Saint Bernard plunged into an icy pond ... what have you done?" When temptations come our way we must intentionally distance ourselves from the source of temptation and pray for strength. Perhaps one practice we can start is praying a Hail Mary as we physically walk away from any potential occasions of sin.

Let us also realize that every sin is tempting us with a twisted version of something good. So instead of just running away from evil, let us run towards what is true, good and beautiful. For example, we won't fall into the temptation to gossip if we form the habit of building people up with our words. We will be less likely to get angry if we practice kind acts towards our neighbour. We won't fall into the sin of lust if we strive to sacrificially love others. This Lent, let us begin to run away from sinful temptations and fill ourselves with good things from God instead. This will allow us to become holier stewards, which will lead to the revitalization of our parishes as our holiness and charity will point others to the love of Christ.

In-person Holy Communion will be distributed after **Sunday Virtual Masses from 1 pm to 2 pm** starting this **First Sunday of Lent, Feb. 21**st.

- A brief Communion Service.
- Please wear masks during the service except while receiving communion.

Receiving communion on the tongue will not be offered



UPDATES & ANNOUNCEMENTS

COVID19 SITUATION:

On February 22nd, we will know which zone or color code we will enter into depending on the trend in public health indicators. It looks like, it will be basically the same situation in terms of restrictions.

LENTEN REFLECTIONS:

Since we will not be having a parish mission this year, we have made available, a link in our website to access daily Lenten Reflections starting Ash Wednesday.



VIRTUAL STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

After Ash Wednesday, every Friday evening we will have Virtual Stations of the Cross. It will start on February 19, at 7pm.

FAMILY STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

On March 19, 2021, Pope Francis will launch the Year "Amoris Laetitia Family", which will conclude on June 26, 2022, on the occasion of the X World Meeting of Families in Rome with the Holy Father. In connection with this, we will open the church in the evening for families who would like to come together and pray the Stations of the cross during Lent.

You may register through Eventbrite for reservation. It will be open evenings of Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. There will be only two slots open per evening 6 pm to 6:45 pm and 7 pm to 7:45 pm.



HOLY COMMUNION:

I announced last Sunday that we will start giving Holy Communion after our virtual Mass on Ash Wednesday, and subsequently, after the 12 pm Mass every Sunday thereafter from 1 pm to 2 pm.

The bishop's advice is doing it with properly. We are supposed to have at least a short ritual to indicate the solemnity and sacredness of the occasion.

Here are the procedures:

Be aware that these procedures are not written on stone. Changes can be made to make it better for you.

- 1) Participate in our Sunday Livestream Masses from the comfort of your home and then come to church to receive Holy Communion from 1 pm to 2 pm.
- 2) Bundle up for the cold weather. Upon arriving at the church parking lot, make sure that you park on the east side row where the garbage bins are situated. In that way, you will see the lineup because we will be using the east side doors of the church. You may wait in your car or right away proceed to the queue.
- 3) The People are asked to keep 6 ft. apart while in line. Members of the same household may stand closer than 6 feet, however only 8 people will be allowed into the building at a time. There are markers in a form of a cross on the sidewalk to indicate the 6-foot distance. But if the sign is not visible, because of snow, just make sure that you keep physical distancing. Please, make this occasion holy by not talking but praying and preparing yourself to receive the Sacred Host. I suggest that you Pray the Our Father beforehand.
- 4) When you enter the church, there will be a stand-alone temperature scanner waiting to have your temperature taken. Sanitize beforehand or use our sanitizing stations. There will be one health and safety volunteer until you get used to the procedures. Later, we may not need them and that would allow 8 or 9

people at a time. You will present yourself to the scanner and right away enter the nave of the church to line up. There will be no congregating at the foyer.

- 5) In the church, you will participate in a brief Communion Service. Again, the floor is marked to indicate a 6-foot distance where you will stand for the entire service. Pews will not be used. To receive communion, people are asked to receive communion by hand only. Receiving communion on the tongue will not be offered. The communion service is very brief. It starts with Behold the Lamb of God, before the distribution of Holy Communion. Upon receiving the sacred host on the side, 6ft away from the priest, genuflect and leave the church. There will be no health and Safety volunteers to clean and so you have to leave right away
- 6) When the previous group is done, the last person to receive Holy Communion will immediately go back to the entrance and signal or gesture to the next group to come in. If this doesn't work the health and safety volunteer may do it instead. Or a priest when no volunteer is available. Go directly to your car, depart with love in your heart. if it's not too cold, all doors will be opened to eliminate the need to touch handles. When departing the church, please do not gather in groups to talk in the parking lot, but rather simply return to your car. Personal prayer can take place in your vehicle or at home.

We will continue to call those who haven't picked up their offertory envelopes and at the same time, we will also have them available in the foyer starting Ash Wednesday. It will be laid down on a table in numerical order. **PLEASE DO NOT USE 2020 ENVELOPES.**

Please pick up according to the proper sequence or order instead of choosing a certain number for yourself in order to minimize touchpoints. Since there will be no assigned names on it, please make sure that on the first envelope you drop off, you write your name, email address, and phone number. Applying for a free web-based email address that is dedicated just for church purposes might be a good idea. Make sure your hands are sanitized.
