

NOVEMBER 5 – THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them, that you may grow and prosper the more, in keeping with the promise of the LORD, the God of your fathers, to give you a land flowing with milk and honey. Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today."

If we observe and obey this Commandment, we will go on to live abundant lives. That is God's promise. However, we are all human and, like the Israelites to whom Moses was speaking, we slip and fall and do not obey one or more of the remainder. If we obeyed the First Commandment, perhaps we would not disobey the others. In fact, if we obey the first five Commandments, perhaps we would not disobey the remaining five. The first five begin with "You shall" and the remainder begin with "You shall not". Rather than being commands, could these words in fact be statements. "You shall" obey these five Commandments, and when you do, the outcome will be that "You shall not" disobey the remaining five. This is because you have obeyed the first five which encompass Awe for God, worship of God alone, observing the Sabbath, Love for God and Man, honor to parents and obedience to the commands of God. Food for thought?

Having said the above, our God and Creator knows us (as He did the Israelites) and He knows we will fall, and so He provided for us a merciful Great High Priest and Saviour in His Son, Jesus, who is constantly interceding for the Father's Mercy upon fallen man (inclusive word meaning male and female). "It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; He did that once for all when he offered Himself." This sacrifice was (is) complete, lacking in nothing. The Levites were men. They sinned. They died.

We have one God. He is One (Echad) in plurality. Father, Son and Holy Spirit (a mystery). There is no other. Let us give Him our 100%. He has told us what to do, and what not to do in order to live life to the fullest, in abundance. Let's do it! Let us get rid of our idols, our toxic emotions toward others, and let us keep God's Day Holy, love and respect others as ourselves. Amen!


